



Dr. **Denise ('D') McAloose** directs the pathology and molecular diagnostic laboratories for the Wildlife Conservation Society, an international conservation organization headquartered in the Bronx, New York. Based at the Bronx Zoo, she and her team provide diagnostic services and consultation to the organization's 4 zoos and aquarium in New York City and their local and international conservation projects in over 40 countries. She is an advisor for the Association of Zoos and Aquariums (AZA) Felid Taxon Advisory Group and individual felid (snow leopard, Amur leopard) and canid (maned wolf) Species Survival Plans (SSP) and recently served as a member of the National Marine Fisheries Services/National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration's Working Group for Unusual Marine Mammal Mortality Events. She is a Senior Courtesy Lecturer at Cornell University's School of Veterinary Medicine and a Clinical Assistant Professor of Pathology at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine of Yeshiva University.
